

Terra Goolsby is a Texas based artist. She attended the Rhode Island School of Design where she acquired a MFA in Sculpture and remained a Presidential Scholar for the duration of her stay. She also conducted independent research at Brown University and completed the Harriet W. Sheridan Center collegiate teaching Program at Brown. During this time, her artwork was installed at the Harvard Natural History Museum and the Sackler Gallery as part of a study about the interpretation of art in different contexts. She also attended the University of Texas at Austin where she earned a BFA in painting and sculpture.

She was an artist in residence at West Dean College of Sussex University in Chichester, England where she was awarded the Edward James Fellowship for her stay. She has also been an artist in residence at the Vermont Studio Center. While residing in Austin, Texas, she was awarded a cultural arts grant by The City of Austin. She was also the founder and lead curator of the non-profit organization Open Doors for five years. Her work has been exhibited in Texas, England, New York, Rhode Island, Boston, and Connecticut. Venues include The Dallas Contemporary Museum, Studio 107 Gallery, Open Doors Downtown, Open Doors Expansion and the Harvard Natural History Museum.
